



# Roy Betancor

Royce John Betancor was born in Melbourne and lived at 42 Withers St, Albert Park. He joined the Albert Park club one month before Australia joined the war effort and has no recorded wins.

Roy, a dental mechanic, enlisted on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 1915, giving his age as 21. He was discharged within one month because at only 19, he was under-age. After gaining his parents' permission, he enlisted a second time on 2<sup>nd</sup> August as a private in the 60<sup>th</sup> Battalion. Landing in France on 28<sup>th</sup> June, 1916, Roy was part of the Battle of Fromelles on 19<sup>th</sup> July. Roy went missing in action on his first day of battle.

Roy was buried in No Man's Land three weeks after he was felled. He is remembered in the VC Corner of the Australian Cemetery at Fromelles.
