

## Spencer Pedder

Spencer Witt Pedder was born in Hobart and was regarded as the best bowman in Tasmania before moving to Melbourne in 1911 where he joined the Albert Park club. His first win at Albert Park was at the 1911 Henley-on-Yarra in the senior eight for the Grand Challenge Cup. He went on to win in the senior pair, four, eight and champion four and eight between then and 1914. He resided at 155 Nelson Rd, Albert Park.

Spen was 35 and working as a labourer when he enlisted on 22<sup>nd</sup> December, 1914 in the 6<sup>th</sup> Battalion. He was present for the first landing at Gallipoli and was promoted to lance corporal on 17<sup>th</sup> June 1915. He was later transferred to France where he received the Distinguished Conduct Medal for gallantry.

Spen received a gunshot wound in the back on 20<sup>th</sup> September, 1917 and died four days later in Ypres. He is buried in Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery, Belgium.
